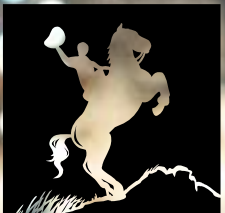

The hotel, rodeo facility, and event/wedding barn have been planned for the past several years. Together, they represent over \$45 million in community investments. We are grateful for generous donations to these

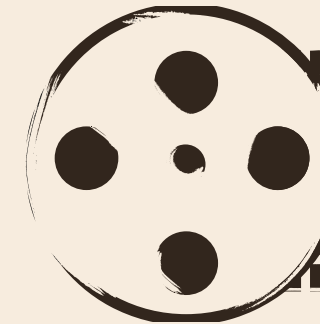
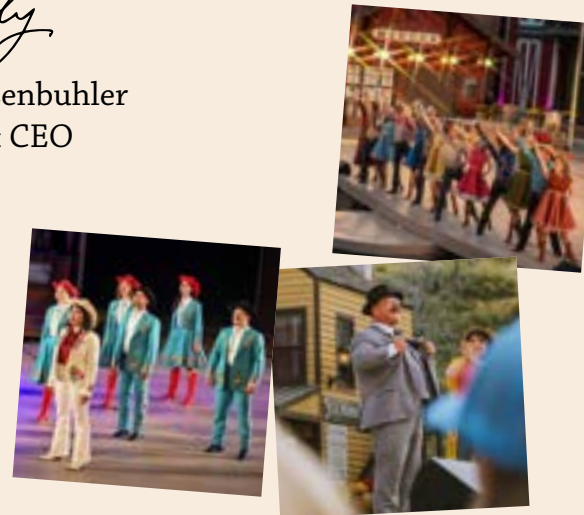
projects and those yet to be made (yes, we invite you to help!).

Randy's Medora Memories

A RETROSPECTIVE MINI-SERIES

As part of his retirement plan, I asked Randy to sit down with me to remember some of his fondest memories of Harold Schafer, Rod Tjaden, and his time at the Theodore Roosevelt Medora Foundation. I wanted to make a mini-series for the quarterly newsletters for 2025.

Randy started at the Theodore Roosevelt Medora Foundation in its infancy as an accountant. He remembers one night when he first started:

“I think I was working for three weeks, and every night, I would read a couple of files in my office. I told my wife I am going to work late because I have to get caught up. I was doing an internal audit of this new organization that was just a year old. So, I am reading through the files. It’s about 11:30 at night, and I think I am the only one in the office. I wasn’t. Around the corner came Harold Schafer, and he sees me, and he said, “Man, we’re cranking it out tonight!” He scared the daylights out of me, and I lifted out of my chair maybe 10 or 12 inches. But what he was doing that night made a forever impact on me. He was signing 5x7 thank you cards and attaching an ivory lapel pin with Theodore Roosevelt’s image to every person who had made a \$5 or more donation to this new organization. A personal handwritten note from Harold Schafer.”

BILLIE RASE

A Hidden Hero of Medora

There are quite a few heroes of Medora. Some are more famous than others, but there are quite a few underdogs that you may not have heard of. One of those heroes was a cowboy by the name of Billie Rase.

Randy Hatzenbuehler recently advocated for Billie to be inducted into the North Dakota Cowboy Hall of Fame. Below is an excerpt from that nomination:

“Around 2005, the Theodore Roosevelt Medora Foundation sought sponsors to help fund the tickets for children attending the *Medora Musical* on Sunday nights. All kids would receive free admission on that night during the summer. I had no idea Billie was a philanthropist when a mutual friend of Billie’s and mine suggested I ask Billie to sponsor “Kids Day”. I responded, “Billie Rase....?, are we talking about the same person?” The sponsorship was \$25,000 for a year.

When I asked Billie if he would consider being the first “Kids Day Sponsor” and told him the price, he responded, “Could I pay the pledge over time?” Naturally, I said yes. Over the next four weeks, he handed me a check for \$25,000 weekly, saying, “This should be more than a one-year thing.”

I will never forget the first summer we had a Kids Free night. I was selling popcorn, and the theatre was sold out, with about 1,000 kids in attendance. When I was making a welcome announcement, I noticed Billie was on the mid-level plaza; he was easy to pick out in his cowboy hat and plaid shirt. I spontaneously asked the audience how many were in attendance that night because the kids’ tickets were free, and it seemed nearly all the hands went up. I told the audience to look to the mid-level where Billie was standing. I asked Billie to give a wave. I told the audience that the kind cowboy had bought the tickets for the kids.

We always try to start the show on time. That night, we had to delay for nearly 20 minutes because hundreds of kids and their moms and dads paraded to the mid-level plaza to give Billie Rase a thank-you hug. Seeing the smiles on those kids and the permanent grin on Billie’s face was amazing. It was notable that Billie made it to the show nearly every Sunday from that point on, too.”

Billie passed away on March 22, 2013. He left behind a legacy, helping families across North Dakota and the country by starting Kids Free nights at the *Medora Musical*. Don & Pat Clement and Michael & Vicki Zaun later created and initially funded the Medora WISH Endowment with support from our WISH Wranglers. Kids Free nights have continued the legacy of our friend, Billie Rase. Please consider contributing to this legacy and giving to our Medora WISH endowment to ensure Billie’s dream lives on.

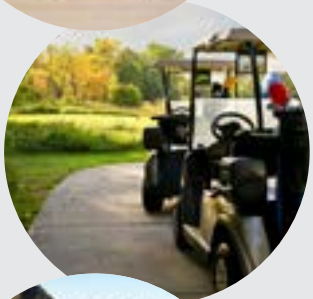
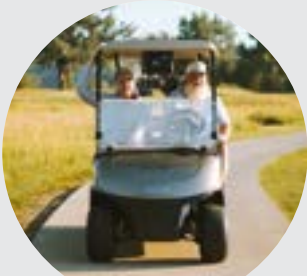
Bully Pulpit GOLF COURSE

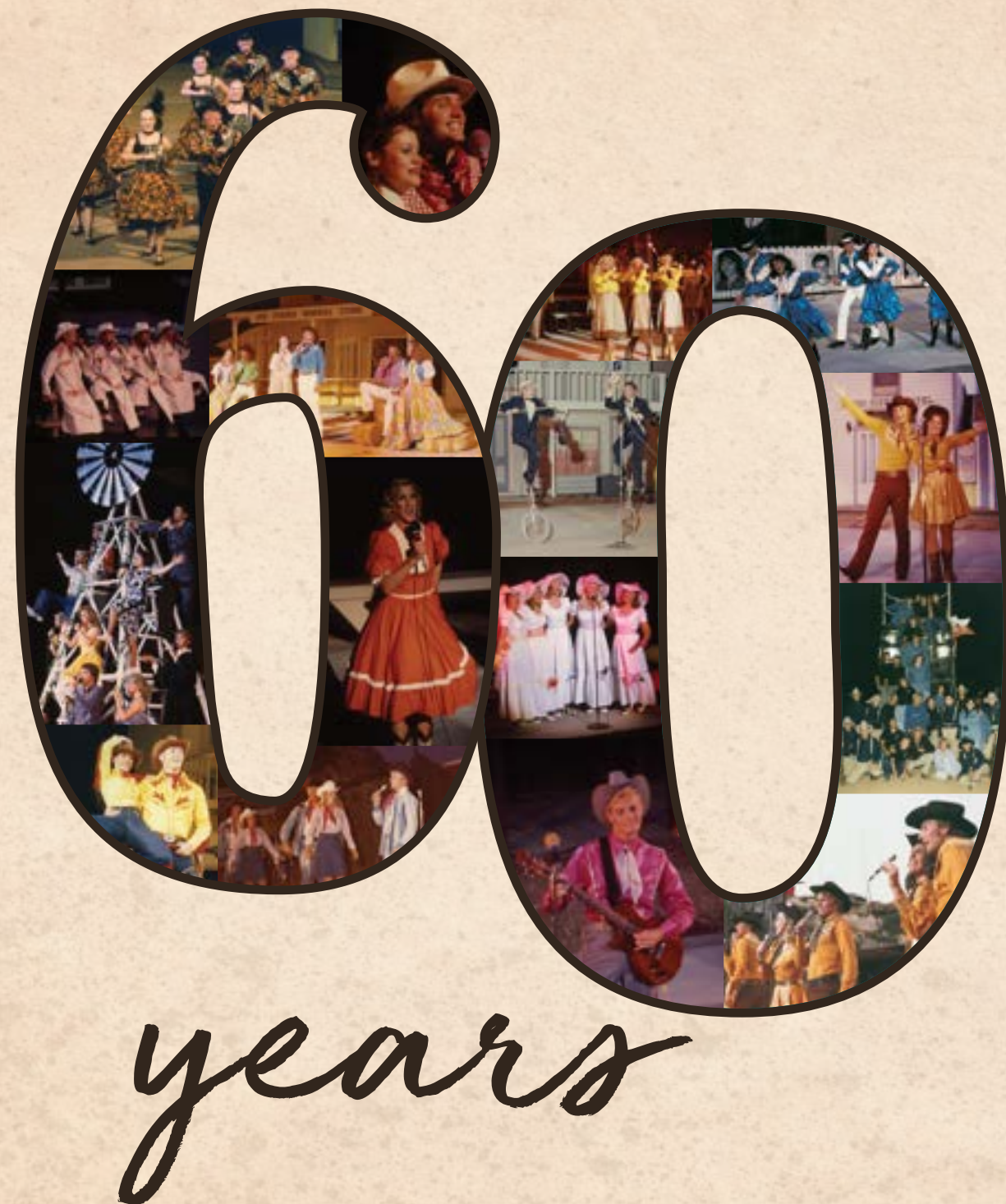
GOLD STAR RECIPIENT
