Later, as a freshman at the University of Mary, I was honored to be part of the very first class in the Harold Schafer Leadership Program with an invitation from Sister Thomas who was a close friend of Harold and Sheila Schafer as well as a founding board member of the Theodore Roosevelt Medora Foundation. It was through that experience that I was able to meet Harold on a few occasions, including a special time in Medora where he spent time with students from the University of Mary at the Tjaden Terrace in Medora getting to know us and sharing some of his wisdom for life. I couldn't be more appreciative of that time and the opportunity to first connect to Randy Hatzenbuehler. Over the years, Randy stayed in touch with me as we both shared a background as CPAs and 13 years ago, he asked me if I would consider joining the team in Medora. As the old cliché goes, the rest is history as I have served as TRMF's Chief Financial Officer and Chief Operating Officer since then.

Our Anniversary show is on July 1, we celebrate our military on July 13, and closing night is September 13 (on which we will honor Randy Hatzenbuehler). Kids will continue to be free on 42 of 88 nights this year thanks to the generosity of the Medora WISH Endowment that was created by the families of Don & Pat Clement and Mike & Vicki Zaun.

We will continue to make Medora affordable by offering all kids a free hot dog meal at the Pitchfork Steak Fondue every night of the summer, so families are able to enjoy Harold's dinner and show concept for as low as \$200.

While we have a lot of building projects on the horizon, I hope you will see that we are not just building structures in Medora's future, we're building relationships and experiences. Through every concert, every stage performance, every historic tour, and every sunrise over these hills, our goal is simple: to create spaces and moments where people can reconnect—with each other, with their heritage, and with the values that we cherish. As we look ahead, we will continue to steward this place with care and boldness. We will innovate without forgetting our roots. We will grow while staying grounded in our purpose. We will expand on the opportunities but keep the charm that people have come to know Medora for: a place of history, a place of tradition, and a place to slow down, unwind, and forget about the busyness of life for a while. Medora will remain a place where people will bring their families, their friends, and their hearts for years to come. A place where traditions are born, and where memories are made that last a lifetime. I am honored to help lead that future alongside our wonderful employees, volunteers, donors, and supporters. Randy's Medora Memories

“Hello, you nice people!”

I got the opportunity recently to have a conversation about the one and only Sheila Schafer. Sheila was a star in Medora, not just because she was a talented theater performer, but because she was a truly wonderful woman. Many people remember her as being a radiant human who was the star of the show, even when she was at the *Medora Musical* in attendance. Many who watched the show with her had many stories, often recalling how she would yell out “HI BAND!” as the band would enter the stage.

I asked Randy for a few stories and memories that he had of Sheila.

“One of the things that I appreciated about Sheila was that she gave without worry. It was common that she would ask people to come over and help her unload her groceries and then would slip a \$20 bill into their hand. If you were around Sheila long enough, you were the beneficiary of either that \$20 handshake or maybe more valuable, 20 minutes of her time. She made you feel really important and really appreciated.”

Stories like this are repeated time and time again about Sheila. Everyone who knew Sheila usually came away with a very positive experience or two.

“Kind of a fun story about Sheila and my wife Laurie, they were good friends. Sheila used to tease Laurie because she became aware that Laurie did not enjoy cooking. My daughter was probably about 10 or 11 years old, and she called Sheila and says, ‘Can I come over and use your oven?’

Sheila says, ‘Well, honey what do you want to do?’

‘I want to bake some chocolate chip cookies!’

And Sheila goes, ‘Well, yes you can, but why don’t you use your oven?’

‘Well I opened it up but there’s a brick in it! I don’t think my mom has ever used it.’

So, Sheila and my daughter made the chocolate chip cookies.”

Sheila was known to be very welcoming to all children. She had a bright smile, a kind heart, and was a joy to be around. Sheila passed away in 2016 and is missed dearly. She loved Medora, Harold, and all those who made the dream of Medora come alive.

60 YEARS THE SCHOENFISH STORY

Cheri Schoenfish has been to every single *Medora Musical* since 1965. Born that year, her family brought her to the Musical every summer, and then she started to bring her family every summer. 33 years ago, Cheri brought her newborn daughter Miranda, who has also enjoyed Medora every year since birth.

In a sit-down virtual interview, the two of them recounted the many memories they had of the *Medora Musical*.

“I remember a few things. One was the old scoria path down to the Musical and the benches that you sat on. It wasn't super comfortable back in the day. But I remember walking down that path, and that was always kind of fun. It was always very exciting to be going to the show.” Cheri remembered some of the early days of the *Medora Musical*.

“My favorite memory would be going up on stage as a kid. I just remember running down the stairs and being excited to go up and do whatever they wanted you to do.” Miranda recalled. “I feel like, overall, it is a yearly thing for my family. It's my favorite part about it, for sure. We've never missed it. Don't plan to. My

mom and I have been going every year since we were born.”

The Schoenfish's have come every year, even when Cheri lived in Australia.

“We had moved out of the country for a couple of years, and we came back one summer and went to the Musical, and when the words ‘come home to North Dakota’ started, I was a mess because we were coming home to North Dakota. We lived a long way away, and that's probably one of the memories that I will always have. That was very special and meaningful.”

The Schoenfish's are eager to visit again this summer to celebrate the 60th Anniversary of the show, and for Cheri, the 60th year in a row that she has been to the *Medora Musical*.

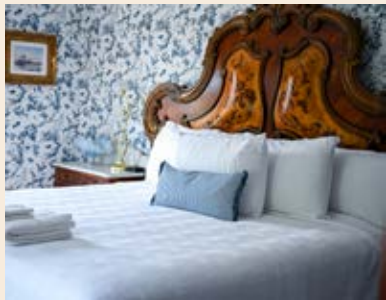
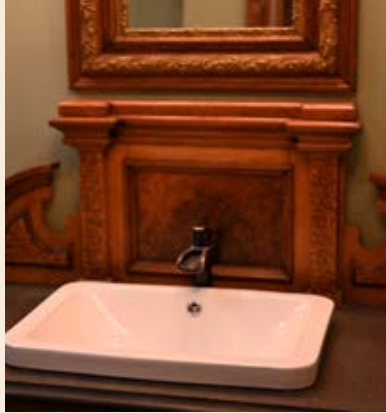


A HISTORIC STAY

Today, this historic property features four king rooms, each decorated in 1880’s finery and dedicated to key figures and places in Medora’s story: Teddy Roosevelt, Marquise de Morès, the Northern Pacific Railroad, and the Dakota Badlands.
